

CERT Training Information for Tooele County

CERT Training is a 20-24 hour course usually held 2 Saturdays or for 7 evenings. To make it more accessible for people in Tooele County to become CERT trained. Tooele County Emergency Management along with Stansbury Park CERT, has set up an online portion for part of the CERT training, and a lecture and skills day for the things that you need to do to become CERT trained.



CERT Skills Training Day and Disaster Simulation

Who: Anyone 14 and over (with parent's permission) who wants to become CERT trained for their family and community

When: July 29th, 2017

Time: Sat 7:00 am -5:00 pm (bring your own lunch, snacks and drinks)

Where: Tooele County Emergency Operations Center, 15 East 100 South, Tooele

Cost: \$48.00 (Includes CERT Protective Equipment and supplies for the class)

What to do BEFORE the training day

1.) Give yourself time

All of the online portion CANNOT be done the night before. It will take approximately 10 hours to complete all the online requirements.

2.) Take Introduction to CERT Course IS-317 from FEMA

 - the Receipt from Eventbrite
- The skills day is a full day of activity. Please be well rested when you come to training.
- Bring a good working headlamp.

-  Medical and CERT organization and operations
-  Disaster Psychology
-  Light Search and Rescue
-  Terrorism awareness
-  Hands on skills
