## Minutes

### 1. Call to Order (13:30)

- a. Bucky called the meeting to order at 13:34.

- a. Approval of Minutes
  - i. Herman Herrera made motion to approve Dec 2017 Meeting minutes. Seconded by Chief Willden. All in favor.
  - ii. Scott Johnson was named new co-chair for LEPC.

### 4. Reports/Action- Local Incident Briefs

- a. SR-36 Bates Canyon Rd - Update on the Ammonium Thiosulphate Spill
  - i. Crash occurred caused spill. Bryan Slade has been in contact with the cleanup company. They have remediated the area and sampled the area and are confident it is clean. No additional issues have been reported. They will wait for recommendation to see if it needs further remediation.
- b. Update on Benson Grist Mill Hazmat Spill/Clean-up.
  - i. No further updates. TCHD is still having contact with clean up company.
- c. Others –
  - i. There was a diesel fuel spill in Erda at new stake center.
  - ii. NTFD is having difficulty getting proper notification of initial reports. Most of the email he receives are post event.
  - iii. An update of the State Hazmat plan is going on and there will be a determination on several questions regarding response and follow up.

### 5. Action/Discussion - Tooele Alerts – Mass Notification

- a. Emergency Management would like to include businesses along the I-80 corridor in our Tooele Alerts system so we can notify these businesses of problems. We would like to have 3 names

per business that could receive emergency information and disseminate it at the business as needed.

- i. Would like to see all businesses be required to provide emergency contact info for licensing.

**6. Action/Discussion – Amateur Radio Club (HAM/ARES) Radio Systems in Businesses**

- a. What businesses would be interested in having HAM/ARES radio capabilities. They would like to push out to businesses HAM radio as a redundant communications piece. There will be an increased presence trying to get HAM radio systems set up.

**7. Legislation –**

- a. Hazardous Materials Emergency Amendments (HB 194)

- i. This gives teeth to a government entity to recover costs for expenses related to hazardous materials events.

- b. Local Legislation – Registered Hazardous Materials Clean-up Companies

- i. Tooele County could put out a list of local clean up companies. There is a county level ordinance it just hasn't been enforced. It also doesn't stipulate qualifications for cleanup agencies. Bucky would like to see Tooele County lead out on the cause. Our difficult agencies are transportation and mom and pop type businesses. Federal puts out the minimum standard. Tooele County can increase the standard.

1. The county level ordinance will be included in the LEPC meeting in Feb.

- ii. Bill Craig just put out the info on a new licensed individual in Tooele County who is testing a small quantity of radioactive material. Bucky will go inspect.

- a. We have a new initiative called Tooele Responds. They will be overseeing volunteer donations management, training, 501C3, DAT Team members. We would like to see businesses be involved.

#### 15. Roundtable

- a. Ronald D Andrea- UTTR- They are getting a new railhead. Their mission is increasing. A lot of training will be happening out there. They are going full ALS. Fire Dept is increasing. Total strength of 14.
- b. Randy Willden- NTFD- Needs to receive better notification of hazmat related events. Concerned about the blasting loads going up and down SR 36 by Bickford Explosives. Bucky has contact with transportation company. Not much to report at this time.

Expecting hard rain during storms. Most of the water they expect to receive will be in rain. Expecting drought conditions going into summer.
  - i. There will be a fireworks company coming into UID. LEPC will invite them to come to a meeting to report.
  - ii. UDOT meeting Monday night at Stansbury High School.
- f. Regina Nelson- Dispatch- They got approval for quickest route. It is being developed right now. A lot of work for the GIS dept to get this going. Text to 911 has been approved. They will meet Thur to get that going. Working on AVL (Automatic Vehicle Location). Very beneficial to responders on finding locations.
- g. Jay Vance- Stericycle-
  - i. • Stericycle has received its approved air and solid-waste permits from the Utah DEQ for the incinerator facility that is to be constructed on Rowley Road in Tooele County.
  - ii. • We've met with the Tooele County Health Department, Building Department, and Road Department regarding required local permits for construction of this facility.
  - iii. • We're currently working on design and construction drawings with our engineering partners.
  - iv. • The engineering firm is working on the necessary site, floor and equipment plans suitable for a full facility design to support the Building Permit application.
  - v. • These plans will need to be issued for bidding and feedback before they are deemed sufficiently complete to support the Building Permit application.
