 - i. **Reservoir Status – (Settlement, Grantsville, Vernon)**
 1. City and County Officials have been meeting for weeks to plan for potential flooding and to reduce the impact to citizens.
 2. Grantsville and Settlement Canyon Reservoir still have significant space to collect water. Vernon is full.
 - ii. **SNOTEL – Report for the Tooele Valley**
 1. Tooele Valley- Vernon Creek is at 131% of normal on the basin index.
